**Auto Pay:** Automatically withdrawn each month from your bank account and into the city's account. Come into the office fill out the application and bring a blank check with you. It only takes a few minutes to get set up.

Any bills that have a problem and our returned will be charged the Return check fee of \$20

## Animal Control

We are having a problem throughout the City of Orangeville with dogs running loose, day and night, attacking other dogs, animals and people. If you do not think your dog would do anything like this; think again if they are running loose you do not know what they are doing.

Many of you have 3 or more dogs when only 2 are allowed within city limits, if you have more than 2 dogs including house dogs, hunting dogs housed in a hidden spot in your yard that exceed the amount, they are also unlicensed please come into compliance. All dogs need to be licensed if they are within city limits. Please help with these problems by keeping your dogs at home, restrained and having them licensed.

Please be aware that a new strain of rabies is working its way into Utah. To battle this please get your dogs rabies shot current.
